


The mission of Bessie Sherrod Price Preparatory Academy is to develop caring, engaged citizens and thoughtful learners.








By the end of the 2023-24 school year, 50% of students will score proficient or better on the ELA and Math state assessments or will demonstrate at least 1.5 years of growth annually on the NWEA Map test for ELA and Math. 50% of K-2 students will move to on-track status on the NWEA Map test for Reading and Math.


**By 2024,** the school will create and maintain a comprehensive plan for engaging students, parents and community partners resulting in an overall attendance percentage of 93% and a decrease in suspensions by 10% and office referrals by 20%.
